## Honoring Philip Cook – September Feature

This September, we proudly recognize Philip Cook, a U.S. military veteran with 16 years of service and a long-time dedicated member of The People's Patriot Project, for his unwavering commitment to service and remembrance. Phil's continued efforts have made a profound impact on countless lives across the country. As part of this month's feature, we are honored to share an article written by Phil himself, reflecting on his personal journey and honoring the memory of those we lost during the tragic events of September 11, 2001. His story reminds us not only of the lives lost, but of the powerful unity, resilience, and sacrifice shown by our nation in the face of unthinkable tragedy.

In preparation for the 20th anniversary of 9/11, Phil spent two years creating a commemorative flag, collecting patches from law enforcement, firefighters, and first responders from across the United States and later proudly completed a ten-mile ruck while carrying the flag as a symbolic gesture of remembrance and honor.

Phil continues to carry this flag in commemoration, completing regular rucks and educating children across the United States. This year, he will participate in a 9/11 Memorial 5K in Houston carrying the flag, and next year, he plans to bring the flag to Ground Zero for the 25th anniversary of 9/11.

Philip Cook's dedication is a powerful reminder that we must never forget the lives lost and the heroes who stood in the face of tragedy.

## The 9/11 Flag: A Living Memorial

Today, less than 40 percent of our military personnel were in service when 9/11 occurred. On that day, the United States experienced the worst terrorist attack on its soil. Two planes crashed into the World Trade Center towers, taking 2,977 lives and forever changing the lives of countless Americans. The attack created a ripple effect that has lasted for decades, claiming even more lives as our military engaged in the Global War on Terrorism in its aftermath.

To call it just another terror attack would be a gross understatement. It remains the largest terrorist attack ever carried out on American soil. As Americans stood in shock, glued to their televisions, the world watched as history unfolded before us. First responders rushed to the Twin Towers to aid the injured and recover the deceased, many of them becoming victims themselves. The magnitude of this event had not been seen since the attack on Pearl Harbor.

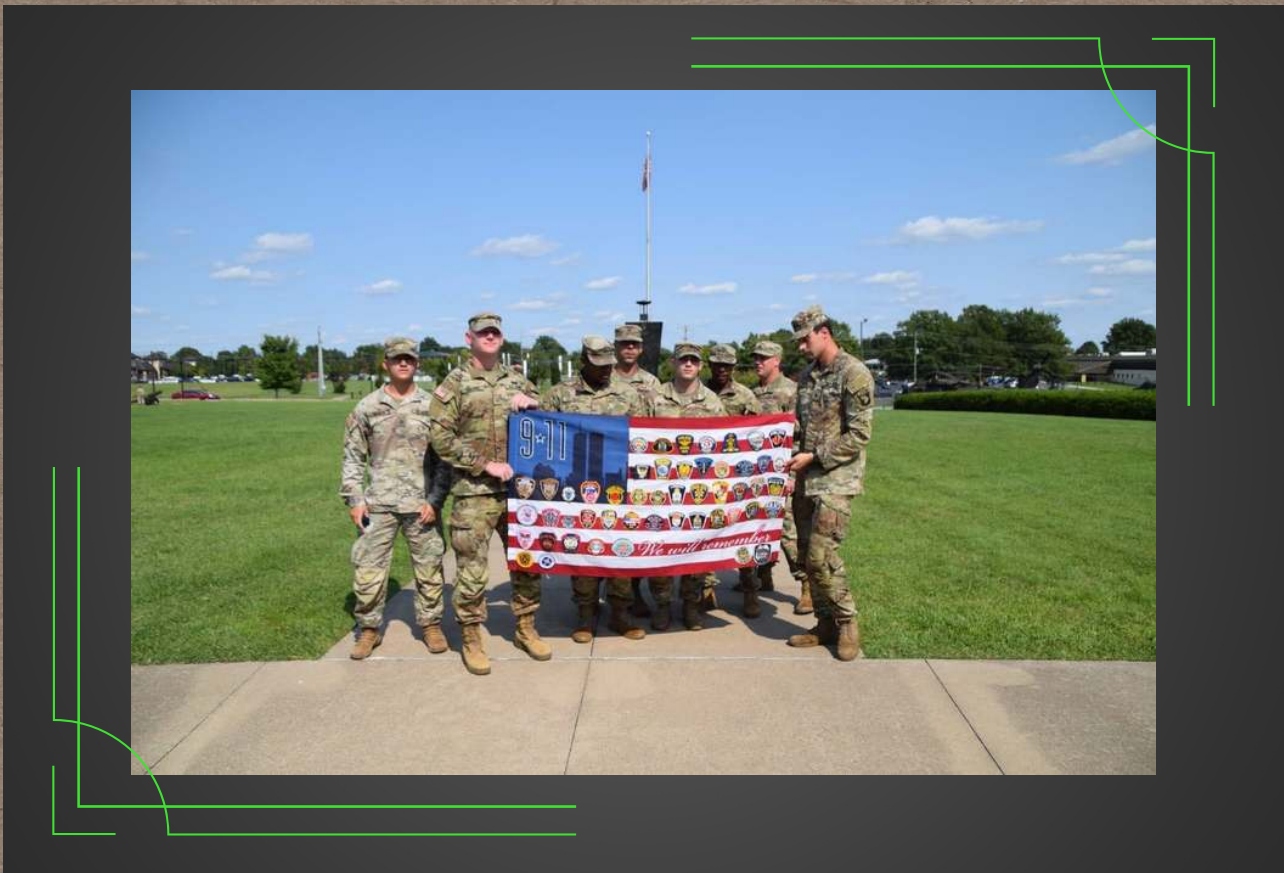
Days and weeks turned into months as the cleanup began in New York City—a city wounded, yet unbroken. In response, the U.S. military quickly deployed units to Afghanistan to begin locating those responsible for the attacks. The 3rd Brigade and the 160th 5th Group Special Forces from Fort Campbell, Kentucky, answered the call and deployed overseas. Across the country, military recruitment centers were overwhelmed with Americans eager to serve and defend freedom.

This flag is more than a memorial—it is a tool for education and remembrance. It serves as a reminder that we, as a nation, have not forgotten and will never forget what happened on 9/11. I have displayed this flag at events across the country and in international airports to share its story and significance.

The flag took two years to complete, with patches sent from all over the United States and Canada as symbols of unity and remembrance. These patches—donated by fire departments, police departments, and various organizations—represent unwavering support and solidarity. This is a living memorial and tribute to all the families affected by the events of September 11th.

Walking the Road Together: A Journey of Service, Healing, and Purpose

It's an incredible honor to introduce myself as a new member of The People's Patriot Project. Becoming part of this mission-driven organization feels like both a natural next step and a full-circle moment in a journey that began over two decades ago.

In 2002, I started volunteering with the USO at Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington, D.C. Like so many others, I felt a deep pull to support our service members in any way I could. At the time, I didn't realize just how life-changing that experience would become.

While volunteering, I met my husband, James King, who had recently been evacuated after being severely injured by an IED blast in Ramadi, Iraq in 2004. His injuries were extensive, life-altering, and painful – physically and emotionally. He often says that moment was both the worst and best thing that ever happened to him. The worst, for the obvious reasons: pain, trauma, and an uncertain future. But the best, because it led us to each other. From that hospital room and those early, uncertain days, we built a life grounded in love, service, and purpose. Today, we have three beautiful children and a shared passion for the veteran community that continues to shape our lives.

Over the past 20 years, James and I have been actively involved in a variety of efforts aimed at supporting veterans, service members, and their families. From advocacy to peer support, from behind-the-scenes organizing to boots-on-the-ground outreach – we've seen firsthand both the heartbreaking needs and the incredible strength within the veteran population

In the last two years especially, our mission has taken on even greater clarity. Together, we have been building a veteran-centered community that promotes healing through laughter, authentic connection, and peer support. We've learned that humor – even dark, messy, irreverent humor – is often one of the most powerful tools for healing. When veterans gather and feel safe enough to be themselves, without judgment or pressure, they begin to open up. They begin to heal. And so do the families around them.

This journey has brought us into contact with many remarkable individuals and organizations that are committed to the same vision – one that recognizes a simple but profound truth:

“It takes a warrior to heal a community, and a community to heal a warrior.”

The mental health crisis facing veterans today is too big for any one group to fix alone. We've always believed that real impact happens when we come together – when we lay down egos, combine resources, and commit to collaboration over competition. Veterans and their families don't need fragmented services; they need a united front.

That's why joining The People's Patriot Project means so much to me. This organization isn't just about checking boxes or raising awareness. It's about action. It's about creating a space where veterans are seen, heard, and truly supported. It's about showing up consistently and standing in the gap – whether through outreach, education, advocacy, or simply being there when someone needs to know they're not alone.

As I step into this new role, I bring with me not only years of experience but a heart that understands the highs and lows of this life. I've seen the impact of trauma, the strain it puts on families, and the long road toward healing. But I've also seen the power of community, the strength of those who refuse to give up, and the beauty that comes from shared purpose. I'm excited for the journey ahead and grateful for the opportunity to serve alongside the incredible team at The People's Patriot Project. Together, we can do more than support veterans – we can change lives.

### Gumby and Pokey Psychological Flexibility



Some of us may remember the old claymation cartoon about Gumby.

The cartoon series was created by veteran Art Clokey. Clokey served during WW2 as a reconnaissance photographer.

The idea of bendable characters brings to mind our lives and how we react to events. There are many of us that are dealing with mental health issues.

Left unchecked, these issues can wreak havoc in our daily lives. An unplanned or unexpected event may cause us to react in a negative way.

With treatment and support, we can learn how to respond instead of react, we can learn how to be flexible when life happens.

In an article published in Verywell Mind, Kendra Cherry writes:

“One definition of psychological flexibility is the capacity for being in contact with the present and acting on long-term goals rather than short-term urges. Being psychologically flexible allows people to adapt to changes in the environment and react in new, creative and healthy ways that align with an individual's goals and values. This ability also plays a vital role in health and well-being.<sup>1</sup>

“What psychological flexibility boils down to is staying in the present moment and being open to experiencing whatever thoughts or feelings may arise, and then take action that is aligned with our values,” explains Rachel Goldman, PhD, FTOS, a psychologist and clinical assistant professor at the NYU School of Medicine.

In day-to-day life, psychological flexibility allows people to adjust their behaviors and routines to respond effectively to the demands of the situation in ways that serve an individual's goals and adhere to their core beliefs”.

Suicide is a tough subject to discuss, but it is one that needs to be discussed. We have to have that difficult conversation! Suicide is preventable.

Each one of us can play a role in preventing suicide. It doesn't require special training, just a caring attitude.

We lose far too many of our brothers and sisters, vets, and first responders to suicide. Studies have shown that a person in crisis and contemplating suicide will not complete suicide if there is an intervention within ten minutes.

Engaging in a conversation with a suicidal individual will help delay the act until the feeling passes.

We have to learn how to get out of our comfort zone and ask that hard question-

"Are you thinking of killing yourself?"

Blunt question, right? It works; it brings the thought of the permanence of suicide into the open.

Suicide is the permanent solution to a temporary problem.

We are the ones in the trenches; we can engage with our brothers and sisters and hopefully help them find the help they need.

Listed below are some signs to watch for if we suspect a person may be suicidal.

- OFTEN TALKING OR WRITING ABOUT DEATH, DYING OR SUICIDE.
- MAKING COMMENTS ABOUT BEING HOPELESS, HELPLESS OR WORTHLESS.
- EXPRESSIONS OF HAVING NO REASON FOR LIVING; NO SENSE OF PURPOSE IN LIFE; SAYING THINGS LIKE "IT WOULD BE BETTER IF I WASN'T HERE" OR "I WANT OUT."
- INCREASED ALCOHOL AND/OR DRUG USE.
- WITHDRAWAL FROM FRIENDS, FAMILY AND COMMUNITY.
- RECKLESS BEHAVIOR OR MORE RISKY ACTIVITIES, SEEMINGLY WITHOUT THINKING.
- DRAMATIC MOOD CHANGES.
- TALKING ABOUT FEELING TRAPPED OR BEING A BURDEN TO OTHERS.

BE FAMILIAR WITH WARNING SIGNS AND RESOURCES AVAILABLE THAT WILL HELP OUR BROTHERS AND SISTERS.

# 22 A DAY - LET'S BE HONEST

We've all heard it—"22 veterans a day." But let me be real with you... that number is BS. It's way higher. And this week, it hit home for us in the worst way. After two years of running Crayon\_eaters\_wifeI775, we lost our very first veteran to his demons.

It knocked the wind out of us. He was a bright light. He was always there for others, even when he was fighting his own battles. That's how it usually goes, isn't it? The ones carrying the heaviest loads are often the ones checking on everyone else.

As a suicide survivor myself, I know those dark moments too well. I know the lies your mind tells you—"nobody cares," "I don't want to be a burden," "they'll all be better off without me." But hear me when I say this: those are lies. People do care. You are wanted here. And it's not weakness to reach out—it's one of the bravest, strongest things you can ever do.

The People's Patriot Project has something I think we should all live by: "I Got Your Six." It's simple. Pick six people—friends, family, brothers, sisters—and check in. Call, text, send a stupid meme if you have to. Just let them know they're seen. Because sometimes, five minutes of your time can pull someone out of the darkest place of their life.

If you're reading this and you're struggling—please, don't carry it alone. Reach out. If not to me, then to someone. And if you're not struggling, then check on your people. Be that voice, that hand, that reminder that they matter.

We lost a good one. And I don't want to lose another.

I got your six. Always.
